Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga are fortunate to again offer Marae stay accommodation at Waipapa Marae, University of Auckland throughout the duration of the International Indigenous Development Research Conference 2014 (IIDRC 2014). This is a modest accommodation option providing an authentic Marae stay experience.

Check in is available from 10am, Tuesday 25 November 2014, check-in information is provided below:

- This is a modest shared-accommodation and sleeping option.
- Visitors sleep communal style on a single mattress on the carpeted floor.
- Toilets and showers are available immediately alongside the meeting-house and on the lower floor of the dining hall, guests are asked to be mindful in use for the comfort of all guests.
- A sheet and covered pillow are provided.
- Visitors will need to bring their own towels, toiletries and sleeping bag/duvet; overseas visitors should contact us if they wish us to buy a duvet on their behalf.
- Basic breakfast options are provided, efforts have been made in the selection of breakfast options to include vegetarian and vegan food.
- If you want to book as a family/group with elderly and/or require special sleeping requirements, please contact the Conference Organiser.
- Alongside Tāne-nui-ā-rangi (meeting house) is a large dining hall named Reipae where continental breakfast options are available on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday mornings from 7am-8am.

There are certain Māori protocols pertaining to the marae and its buildings:

- Food is not consumed on the Marae forecourt nor inside the meeting-house as the area is regarded as tapu (sacred).
- No alcohol permitted on the Marae grounds.
- Shoes are not to be worn inside the meeting-house.
- Clothing is not hung on the carvings or other decorated features.
- Pillows are not sat upon.
- The University of Auckland is smoke-free; if you wish to smoke you may do so on Alten Road outside the Marae.
- Be respectful of others at all times.

- ✓ The Marae will be set up and available from 7pm, giving those staying the opportunity to unpack and set up beds before or after the evening social event.
- ✓ Marae staff will be staying onsite and will be there to assist.
- ✓ Check-out will be on Friday 28 November 2014 from 9am.
